Wellingtonians have asked for better transport options, action on climate change and more accessible housing so Wellington City Council is getting on with it.

The busy inner-city suburbs of Berhampore and Newtown are growing and in future will have a lot more people living here in townhouses and apartments. If we don't support this growth with better transport options, these suburbs will grind to a halt.

The Newtown to Berhampore bus, bike and walking improvements aim to make it safer and easier for more people to walk and ride and deliver more efficient and reliable bus trips. These changes will enable more people to get around in climate-

friendly ways, support growing neighbourhoods, and free up space for people who really need to drive.

If approved, the bus and bike changes will be installed using materials that can be adapted as needed, while pedestrian improvements would be permanent. We've developed the designs based on technical advice and engagement with the community.

We're now seeking your feedback on these proposed changes until 5pm Sunday 8 October.



Changes proposed on Riddiford Street and Rintoul Street



The improvements we are proposing in this area include:

- New raised pedestrian crossing on Rintoul Street to and from Wakefield Hospital and Arvida Village
- Raise and improve the existing crossing at South Wellington Intermediate School driveway
- New raised crossing at the intersection of Rintoul and Luxford streets
- Separated bike lanes on one side of the street, on the uphill sections of Adelaide Road and Rintoul Street, with shared traffic lanes on the downhill parts
- Separated bike lanes on both sides of Luxford Street and on the northern end of The Parade
- Extended 30km/h speed zone along Luxford Street, from Adelaide Road to Rintoul Street
- Changes at bus stops so it's easier for passengers getting on and off, and to make bus trips quicker
- · Reduced on-street parking, and changes to parking restrictions including on some side streets.

Key changes to parking

- On Riddiford Street between Mein Street and Rintoul Street, all parking on the eastern side near Rintoul Street intersection will be removed (P10, P30, P60); and the four P5 parks on the western side will be replaced with one off-peak loading zone
- Parking on Rintoul Street will be kept on the downhill sides of the street only, alternating with separated uphill bike lanes so about 100 parks will be removed, and about 65 parks will be kept
- About 70% of remaining spaces would become P120 residents exempt
- · About five unrestricted parks will have new time-restrictions, and some existing time restricted spaces will be changed and/or relocated.

Changes proposed on Luxford Street



The improvements we are proposing include:

- Raised crossing on the southern side of Rintoul Street at the intersection with Luxford Street
- Separated bike lanes on both sides of Luxford Street
- 30km/h safer speed zone extended from Adelaide Road along Luxford Street to Rintoul Street
- No right-turn from Luxford Street, heading south into Rintoul Street
- Speed hump installed at the left turn slip lane into Adelaide Road
- Judder bars added at the entrances to the BP station to deter red light runners
- Remove bus stop 7123 near Rintoul Street to improve the bus stop spacing along the route
- At Berhampore shops, combine bus stop 7124 (on Luxford Street), bus stop 7424 and bus stop 7125 (both on Adelaide Road) into one new bus stop located outside 460-464 Adelaide Road.
- Two sections of parking will remain on each side of Luxford Street.

Changes proposed on Adelaide Road



The improvements we are proposing here include:

- Three new raised crossings at Herald and Britomart streets, Chilka Street, and at Duppa and Lavaud streets
- New raised pedestrian and bike crossing at Wakefield Park
- New crossing point on The Parade near Dee Street
- New Give Way and Stop signs at several side streets so it's safer for people on foot
- Safer bike route with separated bike lanes on uphill sections, and shared lanes in downhill directions, and separated bike lanes on both sides along flat sections
- Two short sections of shared path on Adelaide Road south of Lavaud Street steps and at the accessway to Berhampore Primary School (at 494 Adelaide Road).
- A new pedestrian crossing at the traffic lights at intersection of Adelaide Road and Luxford Street and traffic light phasing changes
- New speed humps on either side of Dee Street roundabout
- Raised platforms at some bus stops so it's easier for people to get on and off the bus
- Removing some bus stops where they are too close together, to make bus trips quicker
- Most car parks are removed between Wakefield Park and the Berhampore Town Centre
